
SURVEY RESULTS








EMBROIDERY GROUP

As we look forward to the resumption of Guild activities (fingers crossed!) the Embroidery Group is sooo looking forward to seeing one another again. For those of you who aren't familiar with our little section of the Guild, the beginning of the quilting year is a good time for an introduction.

We are members who have an embroidery attachment for our sewing machines that allows us to stitch the amazing world of digitized embroidery designs. Our monthly sessions are a mixture of sewing and sharing – exchanging information on a new designer that has been found – new stabilizers – newest threads – troubleshooting stitch out issues – sources of linens, etc. Our participants have a variety of machines so if one is having trouble, there is always someone to offer help. The Guild's Library has subscribed to a magazine for us - 'Creative Machine Embroidery' - which has free designs and projects that we often do as a group – otherwise we work on our own projects - which provides endless inspiration for everyone else. MEMBER TO MEMBER

I came across this information about cleaning my Cutting Mat. Mine now looks like it's been for a spa treatment!



Moisturize Your Self-Healing Cutting Mat!

WASH
 Fill your bathtub with ROOM temperature water. This is important—not cold, hot, or even warm!

ADD THE CLEANSER
 Pour the following directly into the bath water: 1/4 cup of white vinegar and a quick squirt of dish soap (for lather).

SCRUB
 Use a soft-bristle brush to GENTLY scrub your cutting mat. Work up a healthy lather (thank you dish soap!)—remember to be gentle.

RINSE
 Use COLD water to rinse your mat. Make sure you get all the soapy residue off of your mat before drying.

DRY
 Your options: a) use a cotton towel or b) let it air dry. Either way, keep your mat out of direct sunlight and lay it flat when drying and storing to avoid warping.



LABELLING YOUR QUILT

FOR THE MYSTERY QUILT REVEAL, PLEASE INCLUDE:

1. Full name of the recipient.
2. The full name of the maker of the quilt, not just 'mom' or 'grandma' or 'nana'.
3. The occasion for making the quilt. Christmas, wedding, graduation, etc.
In this case: PGQG Mystery Quilt 2021 Delaware Quilts

OPTIONAL:

4. The year the quilt was finished (which isn't always the same year as when the quilt was started, as we all know!)

5. The most heartwarming of items to include on the label are 'love notes'. Sometimes, for very special occasions, try to write a little something for the recipient. Writing a love note largely depends on who it's for and why the quilt was made.

BATTING BASICS



DO YOU KNOW THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE VARIOUS TYPES OF BATTING?

HERE IS A SIMPLE REFERENCE TO USE WHEN CONSIDERING WHICH TYPE OF BATTING TO USE:

Consider how the quilted item will be used:

- **Is it for a wall hanging, bed quilt, child's quilt, or a decorative item?**
- **Will it be laundered frequently?**
- **What climate will it be used in? Is warmth or weight a factor to consider?**
- **What do you want the quilt to look like after its washed?**
- **It is not advisable to dry clean quilts, due to the chemicals used.**


COTTON/POLY BLENDS have good drape and breathability. They are available in a variety of low to medium lofts and resist bearding. They are great for machine quilters and are easy for beginning hand quilters. Avoid shrinkage by not pre-washing.

100% COTTON is great for an old-fashioned, puckered appearance after washing. Perfect for machine quilting or experienced hand quilters. Has great drape, breathability, and resists bearding. It is NOT recommended to pre-wash as it frequently shrinks. May have seeds and plant residue that can release oils and stain fabric.




Available in a variety of lofts, **POLYESTER** is resilient and lightweight. It is suitable for both hand and machine quilting. It cannot be harmed by moths or mildew but does lack breathability. Pre-washing is not necessary, as shrinkage on most polyester is slim to none.

WOOL is a natural insulator and is typically preshrunk. The resiliency of the fibers from different animals enhances the quilting stitches. While wool is soft and drapable, it may have inconsistent loft.



BAMBOO is soft, silky, eco-friendly, and lightweight. It typically has a thin scrim and is naturally anti-microbial. While ideal for machine quilting, selection can be limited.

SILK provides luxurious body and drape. It is lightweight and typically does not shrink. While it works well for both hand and machine quilting, it is damaged by exposure to direct sunlight.

3. Needles made specifically to sew all layers together during the hand quilting process.
8. Cutting tool for quilting has a very sharp round blade.
9. This is the way a quilt will feel or hang after it is quilted.
10. The grain of the fabric that runs lengthwise or crosswise through the fabric.
12. A name given to the small blocks that join sashing strips together surrounding a block or blocks in a quilt top.
16. A variety of a fabric line cut into 5" squares.
17. Fabrics that have been accumulated for projects
18. This technique is used when sewing many quilt pieces that are identical.
20. When color or dyes from one fabric transfers to another during washing.

DOWN

1. Fabric cut into 2 ½ inch strips and wound into a roll. Used for strip piecing and other various patterns, and also binding.
2. The name given to the embroidery technique where pictures are "drawn" with a series of joined stitches.
4. The three layers of a quilt: the quilt top, the quilt batting, the quilt backing.
5. 18"x22" square piece of fabric
6. A technique used in both hand and machine quilting to flatten an area of a quilt and create texture.
7. A method used for joining together small pieces of fabric to form a more complicated pattern or design.
11. The term for a variety of materials that are used on the wrong side (either fused or sewn in) of a fabric to give it more stability or loft or whatever the desired effect may be.
13. Presser foot attachment that helps to easily feed more than two layers at the same rate.
14. Protective covering for your finger used during hand quilting.
15. A technique where fabric shapes are cut and sewn onto a fabric block or quilt top.
19. Teeth like mechanisms that sits below the presser foot of a sewing machine and move fabric through the machine as you stitch.
22. Long stitches used to temporarily hold fabric in place, can be done by hand or by machine.
24. Sets of extra sharp sewing needles for hand piecing or applique. Many use this for bindings as well.
25. Small accessories used to aid in sewing and quilting.
26. A term used to refer to an unfinished object or project.
